## Headteachers Message

We have had a calm week in school with our Year 6 children having their final rehearsal of the SATs week which will go ahead formally on Monday 13th May. ## Key Stage 2 update

This week, our Year 6 children have been working super hard ahead of their KS2 statutory assessments, which are approaching soon. ## Safeguarding

Are the contact details we have for you up to date? This is a safeguarding issue. We need to have the contact details of at least 3 people we can ring in case of an emergency.


#### Abstract

Absence Please be advised that if children are taken out of school without authority, parents will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice, is $£ 60.00$ per parent/career, per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to $£ 120.00$ if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer, per child, so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. ## Uniform

Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles are named.

## Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a nut free school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

## Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

## Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.
