Headteacher's Message

It has been so wonderful to see the children enjoying school each day - even when wet play is firmly on the agenda. It has also been lovely to see so many of our families engaging with our workshops. This week we hosted two workshops - 'Home Learning Help' and 'Family Regulation and Resilience'. These opportunities will continue over the coming weeks, with further sessions planned for the summer term. We encourage all families to attend so [SIGN UP HERE](#)

A small number of families shared that they did not have access to all login details for the online platforms we use for home learning. While these are shared at the start of the year, we understand they can sometimes be misplaced, so I have asked class teachers to collate all login information into one document, which will be sent home next Thursday. We do revisit and review our home learning offer regularly and although paper-based tasks can feel more familiar, we continue to use online platforms as they provide immediate feedback for children, allow pupils to track their own progress, and enable staff to use assessment information immediately to adapt teaching and support. If you have any difficulties accessing home learning, please speak to your child's class teacher in the first instance.

The LAN Centre will remain open for a further year, meaning children will continue to attend this year and into the 2026-2027 academic year. Due to delays in the Children's Wellbeing and Schools Bill, Surrey County Council is awaiting confirmation of future SEND provision plans. We have agreed with the local authority to pause any further decisions until this guidance is confirmed.

Parent consultations will be taking place in the final week of this half term. These meetings are an important opportunity to discuss your child's progress and next steps. As appointments are 10 minutes long, please do share any additional queries with your child's class teacher beforehand at the start or end of the school day, so they can update you with full information. Details about how to sign up are below.

You may have noticed increased traffic around the school due to wet weather and roadworks. Please note that St Peter's Way (westbound) will be closed between M25 Junction 11 and St Peter's Way Roundabout on Friday 23rd January from 8pm-5am, with a signed diversion in place. We kindly remind families to park safely and considerately, keeping school gates clear. There is 30 minutes of free parking available in the multi-storey car park across the road.

The children thoroughly enjoyed Dress as Your Future Career Day, which sparked many conversations about aspirations and future goals. We were also delighted to welcome Surrey Arts for taster sessions, helping pupils explore creative talents, and Year 5 were inspired by their visit to the Sky Academy. There are many more upcoming events, including curriculum weeks and residential visits. Time to talk

Understanding what makes children and young people feel happy, safe, and loved helps us support their wellbeing and build resilience when challenges arise. This half term, we will be focusing on **Questions to Understand Their Positive Feelings**, sharing weekly prompts to help guide meaningful conversations at home and nurture those positive emotions.

What do you do during breaks or lunchtime at school?



Inclusion Update: Zones of Regulation Parent & Carer Workshop

This week, Mrs Devonport and Miss Johnston held a parent and carers workshop focused on the Zones of Regulation. The session explored what the Zones of Regulation framework is, how it is used across the school, and how families can support their children at home.

We shared how the Zones of Regulation helps children to:

- Develop self-regulation skills.
- Recognise and understand their own emotions and responses.
- Learn that everyone experiences difficulties with regulation at times.
- Manage impulses more independently, helping to reduce disruption.
- Understand how their behaviour can impact themselves and others.
- Develop social skills and think about how others might be feeling.
- Access support that is adapted for different ages and additional needs.
- Use a common language for emotions that applies to all children in the school.

What Do the Zones Mean?

- Blue Zone – Your body is running slow. You may feel tired, sad, sick or bored.
- Green Zone – Like a green light, you are “good to go.” You feel calm, happy and focused.
- Yellow Zone – You are starting to lose control. You might feel frustrated, worried, anxious, excited or silly.
- Red Zone – You are feeling extreme emotions such as anger or fear and may struggle to make safe or helpful choices.

All zones are normal - what matters is learning how to recognise them and use strategies to move towards the Green Zone when needed.

How You Can Support at Home? You can support your child by:

- Talking about emotions using the Zones language.
- Naming feelings as they arise: *“It looks like you might be in the Yellow Zone.”*
- Modelling strategies such as deep breathing, taking a break, or asking for help.
- Using films or stories to discuss emotions and behaviours together.

These scenes are a fun and accessible way to talk about emotions and regulation with children of all ages.

Messages from the School Office

Uniform

We want children to be proud of Darley Dene and to take a pride in their appearance whilst wearing our school uniform, encouraging a sense of belonging amongst the children as well as embedding our identity in the wider community. Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles **are named**.

Earrings

It is a Trust-wide stipulation that school children must not wear earrings while taking part in PE lessons. Members of staff cannot remove earrings on behalf of children so a child must be able to remove their earrings independently or alternatively the earrings are removed before they come to school. Children with newly pierced ears are included in these guidelines and so are also required to remove their earrings; the duration of the lesson is not long enough to allow piercings to close over. Additionally, we are not able to allow children to take part in lessons with plasters covering earrings so it is imperative that children learn to remove/insert earrings themselves.

Pupil Premium/FSM

Have your circumstances changed? You may qualify for your child to have free school meals and other benefits under the Pupil Premium/FSM scheme from Surrey County Council. Scan the QR code to check.



Breakfast and After School Club

Breakfast and ASC are bookable via Scopay. Please book 24 hours in advance to secure your child's space - **Please note credit is needed on your account in order to book sessions. If you need help booking, please call the office.**

Entrance to School

Entrance to the school should be via the main school gates only between 08.30am - 08.50am. If you need to speak to the office staff, parents should go via the internal door to the office from the playground. The main office entrance is for the use of Breakfast Club only before 08:30am.

Water bottles

Water only is allowed in children's water bottles. **No juice or sugary drinks are allowed in school.** Please also name your child's water bottle.

Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a **nut free** school. Please **DO NOT** send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches, chocolate crepes for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich or a chocolate crepe we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD
Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
