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Headteacher's Message

It has been a real pleasure to welcome the children back to school this week following half term. We were certainly fortunate with a few brighter, sunnier days, and the anticipation of Spring's arrival was definitely felt during playtimes, with children and staff enjoying the fresh air and lighter afternoons.

I am delighted to share some wonderful news about a member of our staff. Mrs Lidiard was awarded Best Practice Apprentice of the Year – a nationally recognised award. We are incredibly proud of her dedication and it is fantastic to see her hard work rewarded outside of school. Congratulations to her on this huge achievement. As a school, we are always striving to develop and nurture the talent within our team, and this award is a true reflection of just that.

Before half term, our Inclusion Lead, Miss Johnston hosted an Inclusion Review with Schools for Excellence. We received the report, which recognised the careful planning, thoughtful decision-making and daily commitment that underpin the running of our school and ensure inclusive practice is embedded within our culture at Darley Dene. We are proud of this recognition and, as always, remain committed to continually refining our provision to ensure we do the very best for every child.

We were also pleased to host writing moderation sessions as part of our LLT Trust network. These sessions are an important part of our ongoing school improvement work. They provide valuable opportunities for staff to collaborate with colleagues from other schools, ensure our assessment judgements are accurate and consistent, and identify clear next steps to further support pupils' progress. Working together in this way strengthens our practice and ultimately benefits all of our children.

The week began with an exciting residential visit for many of our Year 4 and Year 5 pupils, who spent three days at Bowles Rock in Kent. The children had an amazing experience, which is detailed further below, and demonstrated incredible determination and resilience throughout their activities. A big thank you goes to Mrs Mackie, Ms. McIsaac, Miss Oomen and Miss Ribeiro who attended and made this memorable experience possible.

Back in school, we held an RE Pause Day to recognise Ramadan. The whole-school assembly focused on how Ramadan is observed and celebrated, and the children contributed thoughtful and meaningful reflections. It was a lovely opportunity to deepen understanding and celebrate the diversity within our community. We also celebrated the Lunar New Year with an engaging Chinese Dragon workshop today. The children thoroughly enjoyed learning about the traditions and significance of the celebration. Thank you to Mrs. McIsaac for organising both of these enriching cultural experiences – please do read on for further details.

I hope many of you were able to speak with our Family Support Workers on the playground on Wednesday. While we already work closely with the Family Centre, we are exploring how we can bring more of that support directly into school so that it is even more accessible to families who may benefit from it.

Finally, a reminder that next week is Book Week, including World Book Day. There are lots of exciting activities planned, so please ensure you have read through the information that has been sent out to make sure your child is fully prepared to take part.

Inclusion Update:

National Nurturing Schools Programme: our journey towards becoming a Nurturing School

Over the past 12 months, Miss Johnston and Miss Oomen have been working towards the National Nurturing Schools Programme for Darley Dene to become a Nurturing School. This supports the school's values in our commitment to inclusion, wellbeing, and supporting the whole child. This programme continues to help schools create environments where children feel safe, valued, and ready to learn, recognising that emotional wellbeing is key to academic success. Being a *Nurturing School* means understanding that children's behaviour is often a form of communication and that positive relationships are central to effective learning and development. At our school, we embed nurture across everyday life in a variety of ways. We use Zones of Regulation to help children recognise and manage their emotions, and High-Quality Teaching ensures lessons meet the needs of all learners. The Resilience Ball and other activities support perseverance and problem-solving when learning feels challenging. Well-Being Ambassadors promote positive relationships and peer support, while parent and carer workshops share strategies such as emotion coaching and regulation techniques to extend nurture into the home environment.

Our work is guided by the Six Principles of Nurture:

1. Children's learning is understood developmentally – supporting children according to their stage of development.
2. The classroom offers a safe base – creating an environment where children feel secure and confident to learn.
3. The importance of nurture for wellbeing – prioritising relationships and emotional support alongside learning.
4. Language is a vital means of communication – helping children express thoughts and feelings effectively.
5. All behaviour is communication – recognising that behaviour often reflects unmet needs or emotions.
6. The importance of transition in children's lives – supporting children through changes and recognising the impact of transitions on wellbeing.

Community Activities Offer

We have been made aware of two programmes the local council are launching for families in the near future. They both look like amazing opportunities. If you would like more information or to attend these events, please speak to Catherine Webb our HSLW.

Runnymede Cooks

The Council has secured National Lottery funding to deliver the Runnymede Cooks Programme. This programme will teach those attending to cook healthy and affordable plant-based recipes through in-person and online workshops. Additionally, short videos of the recipes will be disseminated digitally alongside printed versions in Runnymede libraries, day centres and other venues within the borough. The project will run for a year up until 31st March 2027. For the duration of the campaign, the Council will be running monthly in-person cookery classes for 10-12 people at a time at various venues across the borough (the exception is 2 of the face to face classes which will be family sessions to allow parents to cook with their children). The online classes will be held quarterly.

Runnymede Grows

The overarching aim of this campaign is to support people that want to have a go at growing their own food but may have limited space, time, confidence and/or money to get involved in this activity. The Council is currently in the process of procuring a supplier to provide residents with 'grow you own food starter packs' containing seasonal seeds as well as the necessary equipment and instructions to support people as they start their food growing journey. Ongoing support will also be provided during the campaign. The Council is looking to provide a minimum of 700 starter packs between 1st April 2026 and 31st March 2027.

Reading

We are thrilled to be celebrating Book Week at Darley Dene, where stories will come to life through exciting activities, special events and plenty of opportunities to share a love of reading! Children will take part in creative challenges, author experiences and our much-anticipated *Dress Up as a Word Day* to inspire imagination and vocabulary. It promises to be a magical week filled with books, creativity and cosy reading moments.

Dress Up As A Word

On Thursday 5th March, children (and staff!) are invited to dress up as a word to celebrate World Book Day. Costumes should be simple and affordable, and children should be prepared to explain the meaning of their word and use it in a sentence. Here are some ideas of costumes!



Maths

At Darley Dene, we believe that every child can be a confident mathematician. While the magic happens in the classroom, the **"secret sauce"** to mastery is regular, low-stress practice at home. Think of maths like learning a musical instrument or a sport - you wouldn't expect to play in a concert or win a match by only practicing once a week! Small, daily "workouts" build the muscle memory children need to tackle complex problems with ease.

To support your child, we use several world-class platforms tailored to their specific age and stage. We recommend 10-15 minutes of daily play to see the best results.

EYFS & Key Stage 1: Numbots

Before children can multiply, they must master addition and subtraction. Numbots focuses on "number bond" fluency through fun, robot-themed challenges.

Target: Big focus in EYFS and KS1.

Access: play.numbots.com

Year 2 to Year 6: Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS)

Speed and accuracy in multiplication are the bedrock of almost all KS2 maths, from fractions to area.

Target: 10 minutes a day is the "Gold Standard" for becoming a "Rock Hero."

Years 3-6: Times Table Check

As our Year 4 pupils prepare for the official Multiplication Tables Check in June, and our Year 3, 5 and 6 pupils work on their fluency, we highly recommend using the free MTC simulator to build up their speed.

Target: Once a day to build up rapid recall.

Coming Soon: Magma Maths

We are excited to introduce Magma Maths at home for deeper practice sessions! This platform allows pupils to show their workings digitally.

Top Tips

1. **Routine is King:** Try "10 before 10"—ten minutes of maths before 10:00 AM on weekends, or right after a snack after school.
2. **Keep it Positive:** If they get stuck, ask "What do we know already?" rather than giving the answer.



3. **Celebrate Effort:** High scores are great, but "days practiced in a row" is the stat that truly builds a mathematician.

Fruit and Vegetable Charts

From next week, we will be relaunching our Daily Fruit and Vegetable charts in each class to help promote healthy eating at breaktimes.

What you need to know:

- Children in EYFS, KS1 and LAN are entitled to a free piece of fruit or vegetable provided by school. They are still welcome to bring their own if they prefer.
- Children in KS2 may bring a piece of fruit or vegetable from home for their breaktime snack.

How it works:

- Each class has a chart divided into our house teams.
- Every day, class Dynamos will record how many children have brought or chosen fruit or vegetables using tally marks.
- At the end of the Spring term, house points will be awarded to the 1st, 2nd and 3rd place teams.

Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE

(WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:

£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.

No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child.

Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
