ECERS Feedback

We were delighted to receive fantastic feedback from the ECERS Surrey Interactions Project earlier this week, which has been taking place in Nursery since September. The ECERS team were particularly impressed by the high-quality interactions, the dedication of the Nursery staff, and the welcoming learning environment they have created. The setting continues to provide a rich and engaging learning environment that supports children's development through a wide range of experiences. Recent enhancements, including a new doctors' role-play area and improved outdoor resources, offer exciting opportunities for children to develop their language, imagination, and physical skills. Staff were observed engaging closely with children, introducing new vocabulary, using books and songs to extend learning, and encouraging sensory exploration through activities such as mud play. Calm and sociable snack times, strong supervision, and sensitive support for children's feelings and interactions further highlighted the nurturing environment that supports children's wellbeing and progress. Well done to everyone involved – a wonderful achievement.

Time to talk

Understanding what makes children and young people feel happy, safe, and loved helps us support their wellbeing and build resilience when challenges arise. This half term, we will be focusing on **Questions to Understand Their Positive Feelings**, sharing weekly prompts to help guide meaningful conversations at home and nurture those positive emotions.

Inclusion Update:

Nurture Principle. Learning: Children's Learning is Understood Developmentally

Children develop at different rates, and this can influence how they learn, manage emotions, and approach challenges. Understanding where a child is developmentally helps adults provide the right support so they can feel confident and successful.

In school:

Teachers adapt learning through high-quality teaching, scaffolding tasks, and breaking learning into manageable steps. Visual supports, pre-teaching vocabulary, and additional modelling help children access the curriculum at their stage of development.

At home:

Families can help by celebrating effort rather than perfection, recognising small achievements, and encouraging children to keep trying when something feels difficult. Talking together about successes, displaying work your child is proud of, and asking reflective questions such as "What helped you solve that?" can help children see that learning is a process and that progress happens over time.

Maths

To celebrate Book Week, we're proving that stories and math are the perfect pair. Whether it's counting scales or measuring giants, math is hidden in the pages of our favorite tales! Visit Addlestone Library to keep an eye out for these mathematical book gems and escape into the stories! (Poster attached at the end of this newsletter)



Reading

What an amazing Book Week we have had! It has been wonderful to see our school filled with excitement about reading, stories and books all week long.

We began the week with a whole-school assembly on Monday before children designed their own Bedtime Stories invitations during art and started planning their class reading dens. There were also fantastic virtual author events, with Year 3 and 4 meeting Tom Gates and Reception and Year 1 enjoying the Lovely Little Ladybirds, alongside our popular Pre-Loved Book Giveaway.

On Tuesday, the excitement continued with Year 6 meeting Kamizen and Year 2 taking part in Double Drama, as well as classes enjoying their library visits. Wednesday was packed with even more book-themed fun, including an author visit from Ellie Pulze for KS1 and our brilliant Outdoor Reading Carousel. Children took part in activities such as the Reading Den Retreat, Forest Story Builders, Word Hunt Tagtivate Challenge, Character Freeze-Frame Drama, Sentence Builder Trail, and a Story Map Adventure. Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996. **Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.**

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD
Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
