Headteacher's Message

We began the week with our Local Governing Body meeting after school on Monday. These meetings provide an important opportunity to reflect on the term so far and discuss the progress we are making towards our whole-school priorities. Our governors play a vital role in supporting the school, and we are currently looking for a parent governor to join the team. If this is something you might be interested in, please do come and speak to me on the playground as I would be happy to share more information.

This week many of our staff have also been out of school attending professional development, including subject-specific training, visits to our Trust schools and further qualifications they are working towards. Ongoing training is an important part of developing our teaching and curriculum, and staff will be considering how their learning can best be brought back into the school to benefit the children.

A small reminder about the importance of drop-off and collection times. These moments are key opportunities for children to connect with you whether it is that final goodbye in the morning or sharing something about their day at the end of it. Being present and available in these moments can make a real difference and provides valuable time for conversation and reassurance.

On Monday, Mr Markham also launched how we would be celebrating British Science Week in assembly. He encouraged the children to think about what the world might look like if people stopped asking questions and exploring ideas. Over the week, they also challenged some of the stereotypes that can exist within science, helping children to see that science is for everyone. You can read more below about how we celebrated and explored science across the school this week.

Many of our children also had the opportunity to deepen their RE learning by attending an Easter Experience at St Paul's Church, which was organised by Mrs McIsaac. Visits within our local community are always incredibly valuable. The children enjoy them greatly, and they help to strengthen their sense of belonging and connection to the community around them.

I recognise that some members of our community may have family or loved ones affected by the ongoing conflict in the Middle East. If this is something that is impacting you or your family, please remember that our Home School Link Worker, Catherine Webb is available to offer support, even if it is simply a listening ear.

Inclusion Update: The Importance of Transition in Children's Lives

Children experience many transitions throughout their day, from arriving at school in the morning to moving between lessons and preparing to go home. While these changes may seem small, they can sometimes feel challenging. Supporting transitions helps children feel secure, reduces anxiety, and builds confidence and resilience.

In school, we support transitions by:

- Keeping clear and consistent routines so children know what to expect.
- Using visual timetables and reminders to show what is happening during the day.
- Giving countdowns or warnings before an activity changes.
- Using "now and next" language to help children understand what they are doing and what is coming next.
- Providing adult reassurance and check-ins where needed.

At home, you can support transitions by:

- Establishing predictable morning and evening routines.
- Talking to your child about what is coming up in the day so they feel prepared.
- Putting your distractions away where possible, such as devices, during key transition times like getting ready for school.
- After school, encouraging your child to talk about their day, sharing something they enjoyed or found challenging.

By working together to support transitions at school and at home, we can help children feel calm, prepared, and ready to learn.



Monthly Wellbeing Update

This month's theme is **sleep**. On Friday 13th March it's World Sleep Day with the theme Sleep Well, Live Better. Quality sleep is essential for children's growth, development, concentration and learning. It makes them less likely to become unwell and also makes them better behaved! For both adults and children good sleep can improve mental health and wellbeing.

This month's challenge: Take some time to make your sleep health a priority.

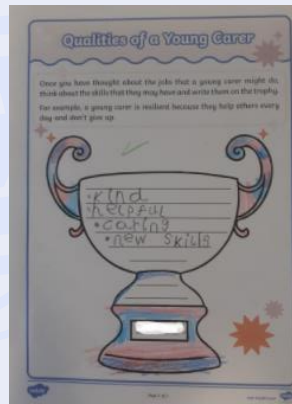

Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD
Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
