Reading

What a wonderful term of reading it has been! From the excitement of Book Week to seeing our reading buddies enjoying books together outside, the children have shown fantastic enthusiasm and commitment to their reading. It has been brilliant to see so many children developing their confidence, sharing stories and talking about the books they enjoy.



As we head into the Easter holidays, please continue to encourage your children to read a little every day. Even just 10 minutes a day can make a big difference and helps build a lifelong love of reading. Here are some lovely KS1 book recommendations you might enjoy reading together over the holidays.

Maths

It has been a truly remarkable term for Mathematics across the school. During my recent learning walks, it was a pleasure to witness our students engaging in such high-quality practical activities. From mastering the precision of reading scales to determine mass, to calculating the volume of 3D shapes using cubes, the children have been bringing abstract concepts to life with enthusiasm. It was particularly impressive to see them comparing capacities and calculating "how much more or less" liquid a container can hold - skills that bridge the gap between the classroom and the real world.

The children are also showing fantastic dedication to their mental arithmetic through Numbots and Times Tables Rock Stars (TTRS). To maintain this incredible momentum, we encourage you to keep the "maths muscles" moving over the two-week break.

TOP TIP: A "little and often" approach is far more effective than long study sessions. Just ten minutes a day prevents the "holiday slide" and ensures children return to school feeling confident and ready to build on their progress.

Holiday Maths: Simple Ways to Help at Home

- Kitchen Calculations: Weighing ingredients for a recipe or measuring liquids.
- Pocket Money Maths: Calculating change or saving for a specific treat.
- Time Challenges: Using analogue and digital clocks to plan the day's activities.
- TTRS/Numbots: Aiming for just five minutes a day to keep those scores soaring!

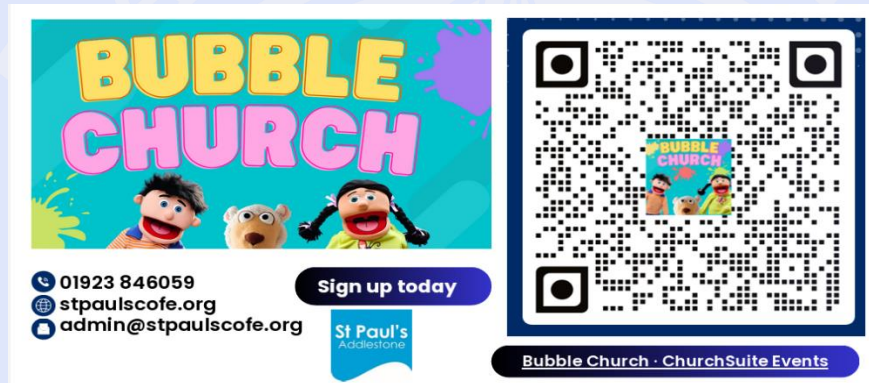
RE

Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:
£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.
No reduced rate will be offered.

3

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD
Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.

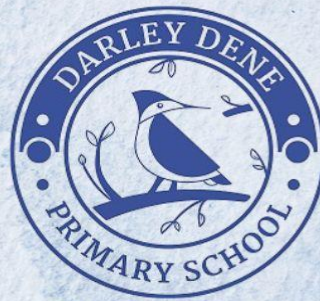
