

## Maths

This term, we will be learning the following:

- measure and calculate the perimeter of composite rectilinear shapes in centimetres and metres
- calculate and compare the area of rectangles (including squares), and estimate the area of irregular shapes
- solve comparison, sum/difference problems using information presented in a line graph
- complete, read and interpret information in tables, including timetables
- identify 3-D shapes, including cubes and other cuboids, from 2-D representations
- know angles are measured in degrees: estimate/compare acute, obtuse, reflex angles
- draw given angles, and measure in degrees
- Identify: angles at a point and 1 whole turn (total 360°); angles at a point on a straight line and half a turn (total 180°); other multiples of 90°.

## DT

Read, set, bake! This term we will be planning how to bake a delicious tudor tart using pastry, fruit and cheese. Did you know the cheese tart was cooked at the court of Henry VIII in Hampton Court Palace?

## Music

We will be developing our skills on the ukulele by learning how to play a combination of notes and challenging ourselves to play different pieces of music.

## Computing

In this unit, learners will use physical computing to explore the concept of selection in programming through the use of the Crumble programming environment.

## French

Where is your favourite place to go on holiday? Do you enjoy going to the beach or the pool? Our topic 'En vacances' will teach us to give opinions, direction and facts about going on holiday.

## History

This term we will be learning about a powerful royal dynasty on British History. The Tudors. Starting from the Battle of Bosworth, we will explore the succession of the throne from Henry VII to Elizabeth I and delve into the lives of the King and Queens in the Tudor Era. Using a range of sources, the children will make informed decisions about the successes and flaws of these royals and understand the impact they made in the 16th Century. From Tudor punishments to Tudor houses, the children will understand what life was like living in Tudor England.

## RE

Why should Hindus live a good life? What do hindus read and practise to enjoy their life? This term we will be exploring the rules and practises hindus abide by to live a positive spiritual life.

These conversations will help the children draft their writing to create an insightful recount into the decisions William makes in his journey for justice. Our growing knowledge of the Tudor Monarchy (from History) will support in our planning to write an autobiography of King Henry VIII and his challenging experiences in his court.

## Science

Do you know when you begin to grow into an adult? This half term we will continue to explore our lives from the day we were born and learning about the different stages we all go through. Did you know that a tortoise can live up to 150 years old? How old is the oldest person you know? We will delve into the different stages of puberty for both girls and boys.
