## Headteacher's Message

As we enter the final half term, there is lots of excitement around school. The children are very much looking forward to all that the end of the year brings including celebrations, special events and the opportunity to reflect on how much they have grown and achieved.

Our careers assemblies kicked off this week in brilliant style. The children were fascinated to hear from a forensic scientist who shared 'real evidence'. It was certainly an exciting visitor and sparked lots of thoughtful questions. These assemblies are part of our ongoing commitment to broadening horizons and helping children to see the many possibilities that lie ahead of them.

This week, our children also 'paused' together to celebrate Pride Month. In an age-appropriate way, classes took part in a range of activities that focused on kindness, respect and celebrating differences. At the heart of our school is the belief that 'We All Belong' so it was wonderful to see children engaging so thoughtfully in discussions about inclusion and community.

Earlier in the week, Echelford, who are also part of the Lumen Learning Trust, hosted the Summer of Songs concert. It was wonderful to see the joy as the children performed and the confidence they showed.

Our Mental Health and Wellbeing survey was sent out to families this week. The survey is completely anonymous and forms an important part of how we reflect on and strengthen our support. If you do require specific support, please speak directly to your child's class teacher or our Home School Link Worker, who will be very happy to help.

You will have seen in a previous newsletter that we will be launching our free breakfast club from 8:00am next year. We are really pleased to be able to offer this provision to support families and ensure children start the day ready to learn. More information about how to book will be shared soon.

As a reminder, our uniform expectations are in place all year round. Hair that is shoulder-length or longer should be tied up and children should come to school prepared for the unpredictable weather. Even at this time of year, a raincoat is essential as showers can catch us by surprise.

I would also like to share a friendly reminder about the use of Snapchat and other social media platforms. While many platforms have age restrictions (Snapchat is 13+), we are aware that some primary-aged children may encounter them. Please take a moment to review the National Online Safety poster below for reference. Open and regular conversations at home about online safety, privacy and respectful behaviour online are essential in helping to keep children safe.

Finally, we are very much looking forward to welcoming some of our current and potentially new families to our EYFS Open Morning tomorrow between 10:00am and 11:30am. If you are attending, please arrive via the nursery entrance; you will spot the balloons! It will be a lovely opportunity to showcase our Early Years provision and meet families who may be joining our school community.

## Inclusion Update - Building Resilience – Meaning (Part 2: Purpose and Belonging)

As part of our focus on **building resilience through the Resilience Ball approach**, we are exploring the factors that help children develop the confidence and skills to manage challenges and thrive. This week, we are focusing on **Meaning** - helping children develop a sense of purpose, belonging, and connection to those around them.

Feeling part of a community and contributing to others helps children develop a sense of purpose and understand the positive impact they can have on the world around them.

### In school, we support this by:

- Giving children **roles and responsibilities** in the classroom.
- Encouraging **acts of kindness** and helping others.
- Promoting values such as **respect, cooperation, and teamwork**.
- Providing opportunities for children to contribute to the wider school community.

### At home, you can support by:

- Involving your child in helping with jobs and responsibilities at home.
- Talking about how their actions can help others feel happy, safe, and included.
- Recognising and praising acts of kindness, thoughtfulness, and teamwork.

By helping children feel that they belong and that they can make a positive contribution, we support them in developing confidence, empathy, and resilience.

## Maths

### Year 1 Maths Challenge

On Thursday, a group of our Year 1 pupils proudly represented the school at Saxon Primary School at a Maths Challenge Event. The children performed brilliantly, demonstrating wonderful teamwork by happily sharing resources and even using each other's fingers to tackle counting problems together. Their enthusiasm was wonderful to see, with several children overheard exclaiming, "I love Maths!" and eagerly asking, "Can we do this again next week?" We are incredibly proud of their fantastic effort and supportive attitudes.



It has been fantastic observing Tagtiv8 across the school this week, with children up, moving, and actively enjoying their Maths through times tables and time-matching games.

## Attendance & Fixed Penalty Notices

### Amount Payable for a Penalty Notice and Consequences for repeat unauthorised absences

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, **per parent/carer per child**, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, **per parent/carer per child**, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

**Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.**

# Darley Dene Primary School Penalty Notice and Fines

#### FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:  
**£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.**  
Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

2

#### SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be:  
**£160 per parent per child if paid within 28 days.**  
No reduced rate will be offered.

3

#### THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN 3 YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance a Penalty Notice will not be issued, and the case will be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court. Magistrates fines can be up to £2500 per parent, per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on a parent's future DBS certificate, due to failure to safeguard a child's education.

**10 SESSIONS (5 DAYS) OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10-WEEK PERIOD**  
Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there has been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10-week period.
