
Today, Mrs. Devonport was monitoring the oracy skills your children are gaining in their classrooms. Both she and the specialist teacher who was visiting were amazed by the standard of talk in our classrooms to very well done to everyone.

From Monday, the blinds in Sparrows will be pulled down at the end of the day to support dismissal. Some children find it very tricky to wait to be called to their grown-up if they can see them and this will allow Miss Bernard to left everyone go as quickly as possible without it causing too much distress.

Next Tuesday is our Hello Yellow day to raise money for the mental health charity, Young Minds. Please encourage children to wear a yellow accessory along with their usual school uniform and send them in with a £1 donation if you are able to. Thanks to Miss Legg for organizing this and the related events and learning in school. To support our children in emotional resilience, we have Mrs. Jones working with identified individuals on an ELSA programme. This is a specialist intervention for which Mrs. Jones has received in depth training and so if your child is going to be having ELSA sessions, you will be asked to sign a consent form. Access to ELSA sessions is via class teachers asking Mrs. Gardner if ELSA may be the right way to support a child and Mrs. Gardner then identifying a suitable session slot for them. A few slots are kept clear each week for children who need a rapid response to an issue but again, these are overseen by a member of the leadership team.

On Wednesday, Mrs. Oliver has organized a Harvest Festival celebration. We would be delighted to receive donations so please have a look around at home for something you have plenty of - in my house it is pasta sauce - and send it into school to be sent to the Salvation Army.

Gold Leaves



Absence

If your child is unwell or off school for another reason, please ensure that you phone the school office promptly on the first day of absence by 8:00am and report by pressing 1. Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a nut free school. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.



Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.

- Play dough, puzzles, Rubik's games, book corner, kitchen area. Lego, bingo, transformers, costumes, construction, dominos, 4 in a row, cards, balloons, dolls. Engines, bowling and a wide selection of board games.
- We have plenty of puzzle words, cut-outs, water colour, painting and colouring.
- We promote "Reading for Pleasure" and free art, providing different sorts of materials every week to expand our children's imagination.

Breakfast Club

- The Breakfast Club is a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment, provided for those children who may have parents or carers with work commitments outside of the usual school hours.
- Children who join us for Breakfast Club enjoy an array of activities *from reading and crafts, to games* and *puzzles* - supervised by our friendly and experienced team.
- The children are provided with a delicious and nutritious breakfast which includes **bagels**, **toast**, **juice**, **cereal**, **yoghurts and a variety of spreads and preserves**.


