All of the children were super engaged throughout the session and were able to share and take turns with all of the resources on offer. We heard some fantastic comments whilst the children were engaged in their play and developing new vocabulary throughout! This was an unforgettable experience for the children and I am sure they will be just as thrilled to share this with you all.

Year 5 & 6 Girls' LLT Football Tournament

Last Friday, five Year 5 pupils and two Year 6 students had the opportunity to represent Darley Dene at a Lumen Learning Trust interschool football tournament. The girls had trained hard at break and lunchtimes and had a whole term of football in Autumn 1 to practise their skills. Their resilience, determination and sportsmanship glimmered through the pitch and gained them 2 goals against Waton Oak. Faye from Year 6 led the team as captain and won the award for sportsmanship on the pitch. Poppy, from Year 6, recalled the experience as being 'fun' as they went head to head with the other schools on the pitch and Scarlett (Year 5) enjoyed the game and the football advice from Mr Smith. "The football tournament was insane" said Poppy from Year 5 and she felt proud representing Darley Dene in this sporting experience. Once again, we are so proud of all the girls in Upper Key Stage 2 that participated in the tournament and look forward to supporting them in future tournaments.

Superhero Day

On Monday, we were surrounded by Superheros of every different kind as Woodpeckers enjoyed their WOW day introducing their new topic. Everyone came dressed as a Superhero and the day's activities were based around what makes a Superhero. They made different pieces of equipment that their Superhero might use and measured distances they could get their Superhero to travel. They practiced their throwing skills into a target using an accurate trajectory. They made Superhero poses and wrote about their Superhero and the characteristics they might have. We finished the afternoon with Superhero Charades which was lots of fun. A great day had by all!

Attendance

As I know Ms. Kober has shared several times – every day counts when it comes to school! Low attendance has been shown to have such poor long-term consequences in terms of your child's achievement as they go through their school career.

Holidays in term time will not be authorized and you run the risk of being given a Penalty Notice. The amount payable for a Penalty Notice issued in any of the circumstances described below is £60 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the Notice, rising to £120 if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. If the Penalty Notice is not paid, the Local Authority must consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court for the offence for which the Notice was originally issued.

Please be aware that each parent is liable to receive a Penalty Notice for each child who incurs unauthorised absences, for example, if there are two parents and one child, each parent will receive one Penalty Notice.

If there are two parents, and two children incur unauthorised absences, each parent will receive two Penalty Notices, which in this case would amount to £120 each if paid within 28 days.

A Penalty Notice may be issued as an alternative to the prosecution of a parent/carer for their child's unauthorised absence from school and will be used by Surrey County Council in the following circumstances:

1. Pupils identified by police and education welfare officers engaged on Truancy Patrols and who have incurred unauthorised absences.

2. Leave of absence in term time (5 days or 10 sessions or more). Please be aware that The Education (Pupil Registration) (England) (Amendment) Regulations 2013, which became law on 1st September 2013 state that Headteachers may not grant any leave of absence during term time unless there are exceptional circumstances. The Headteacher is also required to determine the number of school days a child can be away from school if leave is granted.

In such cases the Headteacher/Governing Body have to judge whether there are exceptional circumstances and may request that the Local Authority issue Penalty Notices when the absence is not authorised. Warnings will not be given where it can be shown that parents have been notified that such absences will not be authorised.

3. The issue of a Penalty Notice will also be considered where it is judged that a parent is failing to ensure their child's regular school attendance. This will be considered when a pupil has incurred 7 or more unauthorised sessions in the previous 6 school weeks, which may include a pupil arriving late after close of registration.

If you believe at any stage that your child's absence from school may leave you liable to receive a Penalty Notice, it is extremely important that you take action without delay to secure their regular attendance. If you have any questions or require further support to achieve an improvement, please contact the school or the Education Inclusion Office.

Parking

We've once again had parents pulling up and/or parking on the yellow lines outside the school gate to drop their child off in the mornings. This is dangerous and a child could be injured as a result. Please use the Waitrose car park or surrounding roads. We have shared this information with the Police and Surrey County Council.

Celebration

All of our children are enjoying the opportunity to earn one of the new certificates. Well done to all of the children who have already been successful and good luck to everyone else for the coming weeks.

Safeguarding

Now that the days are getting shorter and it is darker earlier, if you would still like your child to walk home alone after an Enrichment Club at 4.20 – we ask that you give us additional permission to enable them to do this. Please contact the school office office.darleydene@lumenlearningtrust.co.uk who can send you paperwork that will need completing.

Absence

If your child is unwell or off school for another reason, please ensure that you phone the school office promptly on the first day of absence by 8:00am and report by pressing 1. We will contact you if your child is not in school when the registers close. For any medical appointments please email a copy of your appointment to the school office.

Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a nut free school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.

- Play dough, puzzles, Rubik's games, book corner, kitchen area. Lego, bingo, transformers, costumes, construction, dominos, 4 in a row, cards, balloons, dolls. Engines, bowling and a wide selection of board games.
- We have plenty of puzzle words, cut-outs, water colour, painting and colouring.
- We promote "Reading for Pleasure" and free art, providing different sorts of materials every week to expand our children's imagination.

Breakfast Club

- The Breakfast Club is a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment, provided for those children who may have parents or carers with work commitments outside of the usual school hours.
- Children who join us for Breakfast Club enjoy an array of activities from reading and crafts, to games
 and puzzles supervised by our friendly and experienced team.
- The children are provided with a delicious and nutritious breakfast which includes bagels, toast, juice, cereal, yoghurts and a variety of spreads and preserves.
- The Club can be booked online through ScoPay and operates from the school premises from 7.35am until the start of the school day.
