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Headteacher's Message

We've had a very busy Anti-Bullying Week this week, where the children had many opportunities to think hard about what is bullying and the harm it can cause. Yesterday we were treated to a fantastic house singing competition where each house sang a song focused on the "power of words". Reading

Last week we welcomed one of our local governors, Ms. Jenny Cheetham, who spent time with Mrs. Butler reviewing the developments to our reading provision through all the work that is going into our teaching of Phonics in our younger years. The feedback from this visit was very positive: Ms. Cheetham commented on the calm classrooms, the clear progression from Nursery through to Year 2 and the evident commitment by the staff to ensuring that the provision was just right for every child. We're very grateful for the time our governors give to helping us review all aspects of our provision.

Phonics & Reading Workshop - Tues 21st November 2.00-3.00pm

Staying with Reading & Phonics – don't forget - next week we have our phonics and reading workshop on Tuesday 21st November from 2pm - 3pm. During this workshop, we will share with you how we teach phonics and reading in school and the vocabulary used. Anti-Bullying Week

At Darley Dene this week, we have been participating in 'Anti-Bullying Week' and recognising this year's theme 'Make a noise'. On Monday, we started the week by wearing odd socks to show our understanding that everyone is different and that is OK. On Tuesday, Miss Legg and some of the Dynamos led a whole school assembly. A special well done to the Dynamos who took part in this. Within the assembly, we explored Banter vs Bullying and later in the week classes took part in an exciting Banter Vs Bullying debate. Across KS2, the children really enjoyed the opportunity to express their opinions and challenge each others responses. On Tuesday afternoon, everyone enjoyed an across school meet up where classes merged together to focus on communication and team building. Yesterday, KS1 and 2 participated in a house competition focusing on the 'power of words'. Our judges were blown

away by everyone's involvement and each team was awarded house points. This week has been a great success and we look forward to many more whole school events throughout the school year.

Messages from the School Office

Safeguarding

Now that the days are getting shorter and it is darker earlier, if you would still like your child to walk home alone after an Enrichment Club at 4.20 – we ask that you give us additional permission to enable them to do this. Please contact the school office office.darleydene@lumenlearningtrust.co.uk who can send you paperwork that will need completing.

Absence

If your child is unwell or off school for another reason, please ensure that you phone the school office promptly on the first day of absence by 8:00am and report by pressing 1. We will contact you if your child is not in school when the registers close. For any medical appointments please email a copy of your appointment to the school office.

Uniform

Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles are named.

Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a **nut free** school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.

- Play dough, puzzles, Rubik's games, book corner, kitchen area. Lego, bingo, transformers, costumes, construction, dominos, 4 in a row, cards, balloons, dolls. Engines, bowling and a wide selection of board games.
- We have plenty of puzzle words, cut-outs, water colour, painting and colouring.
- We promote "Reading for Pleasure" and free art, providing different sorts of materials every week to expand our children's imagination.

Breakfast Club

- The Breakfast Club is a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment, provided for those children who may have parents or carers with work commitments outside of the usual school hours.
- Children who join us for Breakfast Club enjoy an array of activities from reading and crafts, to games
 and puzzles supervised by our friendly and experienced team.
- The children are provided with a delicious and nutritious breakfast which includes bagels, toast, juice, cereal, yoghurts and a variety of spreads and preserves.
- The Club can be booked online through ScoPay and operates from the school premises from 7.35am until the start of the school day.
