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## **Headteacher's Message**

## Welcome to the new term

I hope everyone enjoyed their break from school and that the return to routine is a welcome one. The children have made an excellent start and have settled well.

We will be focusing on the quality of teaching this term alongside pupil welfare and fostering a love of reading. These priorities take up little space on when written on a page but are significant, ongoing tasks, which take considerable effort from leaders and teachers. We will be asking for families to contribute ideas and actions towards achieving these aims and hope that you will be ready to actively participate. Members of our local governing body will also be visiting school to support the leadership team in asking searching questions about our journey towards achieving good outcomes for your children in all areas of school life.

## **Parking**

Before the Christmas holidays, a number of parents mentioned concerns about parking on the double yellow lines outside the main gate. Last academic year I raised a complaint about this situation and we were visited by members of the local council who assessed the situation. During their visit, I was informed that we could expect yellow zig-zag lines to be painted by our main entrance within 6 months but this time period has now passed. Over Christmas I completed another form on the local council website and received a reply to say that my comments would be noted and included in the 2022 review. I made direct contact with our local community engagement officer to say that the form and auto-response are out of date and he has shared this with the county council.

I will continue to ask for further guidance around parking near to school but for now, would ask that everyone is at least careful when opening and closing car doors and controlling your speed wherever you are. Whilst it is not illegal to drop-off on the double yellow lines, it is illegal to wait or park on them unless you display a blue-badge. It is also possible to be prosecuted for obstructing a pavement. In the rush of family routines at the beginning and end of the day I do understand that it can feel quicker or easier to do what you need without stopping to think about others. At the same time, I know how desperately sorry anyone would feel if they caused harm to someone else's child and I strongly encourage you to pause and consider if you could make a safer choice.

#### **PE Kit**

From this term going forward, children in **Year 1 to Year 6** will be required to come **into school** already wearing their PE kit on their PE day. **Year 1 and 2** will have PE on a Monday too, but their PE kit is *not required for the lesson on this day*. The uniform policy for PE kit and days for each year group to wear their kit into school are as follows:

Please ensure your child is wearing a weather appropriate PE kit when they arrive at school. We would like to remind families that a PE kit is a required part of school uniform outlined in the uniform policy and this should be followed. If you have any difficulties providing a PE kit, please do speak to your child's class teacher, the office or our HSLW, Catherine Webb who will be able to support.

#### **Earrings Reminder**

It is a Surrey wide stipulation that school children **must not** wear earrings while taking part in PE lessons. Members of staff cannot remove earrings on behalf of children so a child must be able to remove their earrings independently or alternatively the **earrings are removed before they come to school**. Children with newly pierced ears are included in these guidelines and so are also required to remove their earrings; the duration of the lesson is not long enough to allow piercings to close over. Additionally, we are not able to allow children to take part in lessons with plasters covering earrings so it is imperative that children learn to remove/insert earrings themselves.

## **Parenting Support**

The School Nursing Service are setting up a Parents drop-in service in **Addlestone Family Centre** on Monday mornings, starting on **January 8<sup>th</sup> 2024** to support families in the area.

The school nurses will be running the clinic every 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Monday of the month starting on 08/01/24 at 09:30- 11:15 in Addlestone's Young People & Family Centre 121-125 Church Rd, Addlestone KT15 1SH.

The School Nursing service can offer referrals, support, advice, and signposting about a range of things including: Dental care, Sleep, Toileting, Health promotion, Healthy eating, Heights & Weights, Behaviour, Mental health and Eating difficulties.

There is free parking available on sight.

## **Messages from the School Office**

#### Safeguarding

Are the contact details we have for you up to date? This is a safeguarding issue. We need to have the contact details of at least 3 people we can ring in case of an emergency.

#### **Absence**

If your child is unwell or off school for another reason, please ensure that you phone the school office promptly on the first day of absence by 8:00am and report by pressing 1. We will contact you if your child is not in school when the registers close. For any medical appointments please email a copy of your appointment to the school office.

#### Uniform

Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles are named.

#### Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a **nut free** school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

#### Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

#### **Wrap Club**

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.

- Play dough, puzzles, Rubik's games, book corner, kitchen area. Lego, bingo, transformers, costumes, construction, dominos, 4 in a row, cards, balloons, dolls. Engines, bowling and a wide selection of board games.
- We have plenty of puzzle words, cut-outs, water colour, painting and colouring.
- We promote "Reading for Pleasure" and free art, providing different sorts of materials every week to expand our children's imagination.

#### **Breakfast Club**

- The Breakfast Club is a safe, stimulating and nurturing environment, provided for those children who may have parents or carers with work commitments outside of the usual school hours.
- Children who join us for Breakfast Club enjoy an array of activities *from reading and crafts, to games* and puzzles supervised by our friendly and experienced team.
- The children are provided with a delicious and nutritious breakfast which includes **bagels**, **toast**, **juice**, **cereal**, **yoghurts and a variety of spreads and preserves**.



### **Spring Term Enrichment Clubs**

#### After School Enrichment Clubs – Spring Term 2024

Clubs will start week beginning Monday 8th January 2024 and finish week ending Friday  $22^{nd}$  March 2024 (excluding half term). Clubs will run for a course of 10 weeks at a total cost of £30.

#### What happens if I choose for my child to attend a club?

- We expect the same excellent standards of behaviour from the children during the clubs as we do at school. This means that any child who does not meet these high expectations will be spoken to, as will the family and this may lead to the child being asked to leave the club.
- Children **should not** bring a snack or drink to any of the clubs. They will use the water bottles that they bring to school to drink from.
- Children will be dismissed from class at the end of the school day by their class teacher directly to the after school club adult leader.
- It is not possible to watch the clubs as it is distracting for the children. Please do not arrive to collect your child
  more than five minutes before the end of the club. All children should be collected through the main school
  gates at 4.20pm.
- On occasion staff may have to cancel a club at short notice. We will always endeavour to reschedule the session
  at a later date either during school time or after school on the same day. Refunds will only be issued if a club has
  been cancelled.
- In fulfilling our safeguarding expectations, all our outside providers undergo enhanced DBS checks.
- There are no 'taster' sessions for a club. If your child is allocated a place which is accepted but subsequently your child changes their mind we cannot refund the cost of any sessions not attended.
- Clubs must be paid for in advance. If payment is not received by Friday 5th January, your place will be withdrawn.
