Headteacher's Message

What a fantastic week we have enjoyed - a huge thank you to Mrs. Butler for her hard work leading Math's Enterprise week which concluded yesterday with a wonderful sale in the winter sunshine; thank you all for turning up to support the children.

Next week also has a particular focus - it is Children's Mental Health Week. The theme this year is, "My voice matters." Miss Legg and Mrs. Devonport have been busy making plans for your children to enjoy and are determined that this key message is felt and understood by everyone. They will be kicking things off with a special assembly for the children on Monday morning and I know it will be a fab week for all our children.

This week we were visited by Jenny Cheetham from our Local Governing Body and next week is the turn of Chris Adams. Chris and I will be looking at online safety which is being included in the "My Voice Matters" work.

On Monday and Wednesday of next week, we have our family consultations. These are 1:1, 10 minute appointments designed to give you an opportunity to find out about your child's academic progress. I always ask staff to make sure there are no big surprises for anyone in these meetings and I would just like to ask the same of you as parents carers. If you are holding onto a worry for your children, particularly if it is something related to behavior or friendship groups, please let them know before the meeting so that they can decided how best to tackle things. If teachers are suddenly faced with an issue for the first time in the 10 minute slot, it can make it challenging to give you the academic information they have prepared.

I look forward to seeing you all at the consultations, Mrs. Devonport and I will be on hand to answer any questions and Mrs. Devonport plans to take full advantage of the evenings to ask you all about supporting your children with reading.

#### Abstract

Absence Some families have been surprised to receive a letter about their child's attendance this week because they do not remember their child missing days of school. Please be aware that when the attendance percentage is calculated, every time your child arrives significantly late, they have to be formally marked as absent for the morning session. This can mean that although your child may be in school each day, if they are persistently late, their attendance can drop to around $70-75 \%$ which is a real cause for concern. Being on time for school is as important as showing up each day. Please speak to our lovely office staff or to Catherine Webb if you think you may need support to get into a better early morning routine.

## Safeguarding

We will contact you if your child is not in school when the registers close. For any medical appointments please email a copy of your appointment to the school office.

## Uniform

Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles are named.

## Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a nut free school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.

## Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

## Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.
