'Slip' is a mixture of clay and water. It creates a very runny clay that can be used like glue!

To 'score' just means to scratch the clay with a knife or clay tool!

Hepworth made some of her sculptures by carving into stone and wood, but Hepworth is most famous for her large scale bronze sculptures. Many of her sculptures are exhibited outdoors.

Dame Jocelyn **Barbara Hepworth** DBE (10 January 1903 – 20 May 1975)



Barbara Hepworth is one of the most famous female artists and is known all over the world.

She made modern sculptures and experimented with new techniques.



The Family of Man (1970) is one of the last major works that Barbara Hepworth made before her death. Each of the nine sculptures represents a stage of life. *The Family of Man* has been on public display at Yorkshire Sculpture Park since 1980.

What is collage?



A collage is a piece of art made from different pieces of paper, photos and other materials.

Collages also might have painting and drawing on them.

Collage artists spend time arranging the materials and trying out different ideas, before sticking them onto a surface.

They tear or cut materials before sticking them together.

Collages can be of anything and might be realistic, abstract, or even surreal.

What is portraiture?

A portrait is a representation of a person. It could be a painting, a drawing, a collage, a photograph or another type of image.

A self-portrait is a portrait of the artist by the artist.

Deborah Roberts' work often features images of African American people.

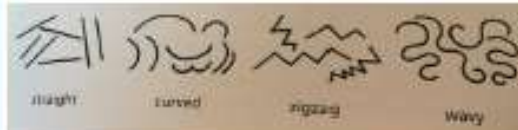

Landscape: An artwork of natural scenery such as mountains, valleys, trees, rivers, and forests

Who is Van Gogh?

Van Gogh is one of the world's most famous painters!

One of Van Gogh's most famous paintings is called "Starry Night". He painted it in 1889.

Street in Saintes-Maries

Vincent Van Gogh was Dutch. He lived 1853–1890.

Van Gogh was known as a 'post-impressionism' painter. This means he wanted to create an emotional impression of a person or place. Rather than create something realistic.

Wheat Field with Cypress

Van Gogh was only a painter for a short time. He started painting when he was 27, and he died when he was 37.

Van Gogh liked to paint pictures of places he had been and people he had met to capture the memories.

Van Gogh painted about 30 self-portraits!

He has a very unique painting style of 'broken up brush strokes'. They look like lots of little lines!

Van Gogh made about 2100 paintings in his lifetime
