Word	<u>Meaning</u>
Conductor	The person that stands at the front of the orchestra often holding a baton, who keeps the orchestra in time.
Percussion Family	Instruments that you hit or shake to make a sound
String Family	Instruments with strings and often a bow. Can be played by plucking, strumming, or bowing
Brass Family	Makes a tune
Woodwind Family	The stick used to play the chim bars
Unison	The music that plays alongside you playing the chimbars
