percentage is calculated, every time your child arrives significantly late, they have to be formally marked as absent for the morning session. This can mean that although your child may be in school each day, if they are persistently late, their attendance can drop to around 70-75% which is a real

If your child is unwell or off school for another reason, please ensure that you phone the school office promptly on the first day of absence by 8:00am and report by pressing 1. We will contact you if your child is not in school when the registers close. For any medical appointments please email a copy of your appointment to the

school office.

We strongly recommend that parent/carers DO NOT book their family holidays during term time as these will not be authorised and may incur a Penalty Notice being issued. Absence from school can seriously disrupt your child's continuity of learning. Not only do they miss the teaching provided on the days they are away, they are also less well prepared for lessons upon their return. There is a consequent risk of under-achievement. Above all, missing school seriously affects children's longer-term life opportunities. Darley Dene will not authorise holidays or leave of absence in term times, except in exceptional circumstances determined by the Head Teacher. Evidence will be sought to substantiate exceptional circumstances. Should a parent wish to apply for any leave of absence within term time then this must be made in writing to the Head Teacher at least two weeks in advance. A 'Leave of Absence Request' form can be obtained from the school office. If holidays or absence are taken, without prior authorisation, the child's absence will be recorded as unauthorised in the school register and you may still incur a Penalty Notice. On the advice of the Inclusion Service if any parent requests extended leave of absence of more than 4 weeks to visit their home country then the school will take their child's name off-roll and the parent will have to re-apply for a place when they return. There is no quarantee, in this instance, that a place will be available. Unauthorised absence of 5 consecutive days or more will incur a Penalty Notice. The Inclusion Service, acting on behalf of Surrey County Council, may issue a Penalty Notice as an alternative to the prosecution of parent(s)/carer(s) for their child(ren)'s unauthorised absence from school, and requires the recipient(s) to pay a fixed amount. The amount payable on issue of a Penalty Notice is £60 per parent/carer per child if paid within 21 days of receipt of the Notice, rising to £120 per parent/carer per child if paid after 21 days but within 28 days. If the Penalty Notice is not paid within 28 days, the Local Authority must prosecute the parent(s)/carer(s) for failing to ensure regular school attendance under Section 444 Education Act 1996

It has been wonderful to see the children curled up on a cushion, talking about a text with friends during their free time.

## **Open Afternoon**

On **Wednesday 21st February**, you are invited into school to attend the parent information sessions and visit your child's classroom to look at some of the learning they have completed this term. Please arrive via the main office so we can begin in the main hall at 2.00pm with introductions and the two sessions outlined below:

**Early Number Parent Information Session -** An introduction into number in EYFS and KS1 and how we teach the children in school, the strategies we use and how you can support at home.

**Zones of Regulation Parent Information Session -** An introduction about how to support your child in using various strategies and tools to regulate their emotions. If you only wish to attend this session, please arrive at the main office at 2:45pm. We will dismiss the children as usual and they will then be able to show you around their classrooms until 3:30pm.



## **Wrap Club**

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups, including Nursery. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.
