Maths

In Maths this term we are learning about sequencing, positional language, more than/fewer than, 2d and 3d shapes as well as consolidating numbers 1 -6. In our sequencing lessons, we will be putting 4 pictures of the nursery rhyme 'Incy Wincy Spider' in order. We will use the key vocabulary: First, next, after that and finally. Our key words that we will focus on for positional language are: on or under, in

or out, in front of or behind.

Literacy

This term in Literacy the children will hear the two main stories 'Lulu loves the library' and 'Hungry Hen.' We will hear lots of other stories based on the children's interests and some more topic themed stories. In phonics we will focus on learning the new letter sounds: f, l, j, v, w and y by playing some phonic games including, 'What's in the box?' and 'Bertha the bus.' We will learn and sing the nursery rhymes,

'Twinkl, Twinkl, Little Star' and '5 Little

Men in a Flying Saucer.'

Expressive Art and Design

This term we will support children to create effects with materials. The children will take part in various creative activities including: adding sand to paint, rolling marbles in paint, use shaving foam and paint etc. We will discuss the effects of the materials and describe them using our senses. We will make collages using lots of different materials. We will be encouraging independence such as putting on the apron by themselves

and writing their name on their work.

Personal Social and Emotional Development

In PSHE this term we will be learning all about relationships. We will have class discussions, learn through reading stories and continuous provision. We will learn about: family life, friendships, breaking friendships, falling out, being a good friend and dealing with bullying.

Communication and Language

We will continue to sing a range of songs and nursery rhymes. We will use new vocabulary learnt during our carpet sessions during continuous provision.


