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Headteachers Message

This week the children have been thinking about what it means to be calm and orderly around school. It took quite a lively discussion to unpick what these words mean and what they look like. We discussed the importance of being able to hear adult instructions as we walk around school and walking one behind another so that accidents do not happen. The youngest members of our community were keen to point out how helpful it is to face the direction you are walking in and we all agreed this was indeed a top-tip.

Mr. Poleykett, Mrs. Tozer and Mrs. Webb all attended mental health first-aid training this week and have successfully completed the course - congratulations to them. This training is an important part of our commitment to the positive well-being of all adults in our school community. Catherine Webb is the main point of contact for all adults in our family community and Mr. Poleykett and Mrs. Tozer will concentrate their support on members of our staff team.

Please can I remind everyone of the importance of good attendance. Recently, some families have expressed surprise at the link between poor attendance and poor attainment. If a child is not in school, they are not accessing the learning and this is highly likely to negatively impact their ability to meet age-related expectations. It does not matter how well our teachers teach, if your child is not here, they miss out. Poor attendance also gets in the way of accurately identifying what sort of additional support your child may need in school.

The government expects schools to focus relentlessly on improving attendance because we know that being in school is the only way to get the most out of school and give children the best life chances as they grow up. New guidance is being published on educational neglect and there are new rules coming in about prosecuting families for poor attendance and educational neglect. If this is an area of school life that causes you to worry, please speak to Catherine or a member of the Leadership Team.



Safeguarding

Are the contact details we have for you up to date? This is a safeguarding issue. We need to have the contact details of at least 3 people we can ring in case of an emergency.

Absence

Please be advised that if children are taken out of school without authority, parents will be liable to receive a penalty notice. Currently the amount payable under a penalty notice, is ± 60.00 per parent/career, per child if paid within 21 days. Thereafter the amount increases to ± 120.00 if paid between 21 and 28 days. If the penalty notice remains unpaid after 28 days, the Local Authority will consider a prosecution in the Magistrates Court. Please note that penalty notices are issued per parent/carer, per child, so a family of two parents and two children will receive 4 penalty notices. Uniform

Please ensure that your child's uniform including Coats, Jackets and PE Kits as well as water bottles are named.

Lunch Boxes

Darley Dene is a **nut free** school. Please do not send your child to school with chocolate spread Sandwiches for lunch as it is not possible to distinguish between Nutella and a nut free chocolate spread. If your child has a chocolate spread sandwich we will call home to request that an alternative be brought in. Thank you for your co-operation.



Medication

If your child has been prescribed with medication which needs to be administered during the school day, please ensure that you complete a Pupil Medication Request form which can be found on the school's website or from the school office. Without the completed form staff will not be able to administer any medication.

Wrap Club

At Darley Dene we offer extended care at our breakfast and after school Wrap Clubs in order to support our families should they require it. Wrap Club is open to pupils in all year groups. At Wrap Club we have a variety of activities for the children to take part in.
